

CUB SCOUT SUMMER CAMP, 2006

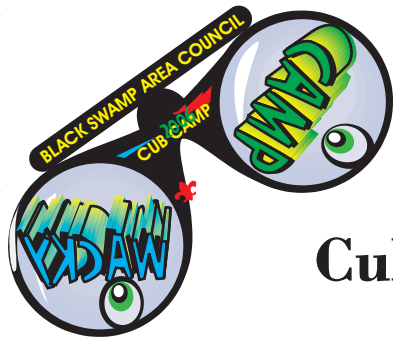
Theme is "Wacky Camp"

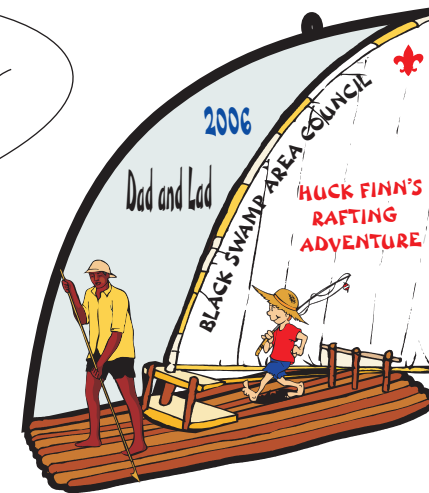
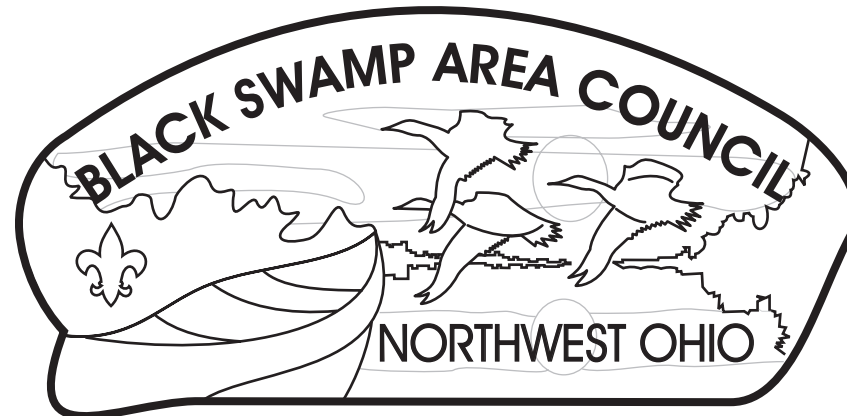
